The Fund for the Arts awards bursaries, currently £800 per year, to students who are studying the Arts at tertiary level, preference being given to those who have performed at the Club's Schools Competition. Our aim is to help students who will carry forward Scotland's cultural heritage, in particular that of Robert Burns.

In recent years we have been helping a group of five students. This has now tapered down to two, one of whom will have completed his studies this summer (2024). That will leave us with one student on our books, namely Amber Blake who will be performing at this dinner. She still has two years to run. Ideally, the Club would take-on one new bursary holder each year rather than multiples. That would give us a steady state of three students on our books at any given time, assuming that they are all on three-year courses, but life is rarely that simple. Looking forward, we hope to take on at least one new student from this year's crop of school-leavers.

One success this past year is that Kerry Lynch (flautist) along with her partner Jacopo Lazzaretti (classical guitarist), known as the JKL Duo, have launched their first CD. It is called 'The International Poet' and is a collection of Burns songs with international musical variations (now available on the internet). The Fund for the Arts bought Kerry her first flute.

Our second success is Amber Blake. She is studying for an Honours degree in Gaelic and Traditional Music at the Gaelic University in Skye (Sabhal mor Ostaig). She has already established her own ceilidh band and had her own programme on BBC Scotland's Radio nan Gaidheal (the Gaelic channel) in which she mentioned Bridgeton Burns Club (it's the same in Gaelic). Amber has been commissioned to write a Scottish Country Dance tune for us called 'The Bridgeton Burns Club', which we hope will cement the Club's name in Scottish cultural heritage. She will be giving the premiere of her composition at this Anniversary Dinner.
